"AT THE TABLE"

Pastor's Message

Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Holy Communion is very important to us at Holy Shepherd Lutheran Church, and it should be. Together with the Word and the sacrament of Baptism, the Eucharist is one of the primary ways in which God comes to be with us as God's people. It is central to our life together. At the table we are nourished and strengthened for daily discipleship, assured of God's forgiveness, bound together in Christ, and renewed by God's promises. Thank God for the meal we receive at Christ's table!

I am writing to inform you of an occasional new Communion practice at Holy Shepherd. That practice is that, during Pastor Michael's sabbatical and on a few occasions when I am also away from Holy Shepherd, in addition to using lay preachers as we have in the past, we will also, with council pre-approval, use lay presiders at the table. At their July meeting, upon the pastors' recommendation, the church council approved the following two motions:

- "On occasions of the absence of an ordained pastor for weekend worship, we approve the appointment, on a case-by-case basis, of properly-trained lay presiders at public celebrations of Holy Communion."
- 2) "We authorize the pastor(s) of Holy Shepherd to appoint and train lay presiders for Holy Communion on the following dates: September 3 & 4, 2011; August 27 & 28 or September 10 & 11, 2011; October 8, 2011."

(Since then, those dates have been finalized to include August 27 & 28, September 3 & 4, and October 8, when I will be away for some vacation and holiday time and a Saturday wedding out of town.) As these two motions make clear, the council has not been asked to give and has not given blanket approval to this practice, but approval for specific, pre-authorized, public worship gatherings.

Normally in the Lutheran tradition an ordained pastor presides at the sacraments of Holy Baptism and Holy Communion. There is good reason for this. With our theological training and call to pastoral ministry, Lutheran pastors are charged with faithfully proclaiming the word of God and seeing to the proper administration of the sacraments. This understanding of pastoral ministry is for the sake of good order in the church—to insure faithful teaching and that sacraments are offered in keeping with a Lutheran understanding. Specifically, assigning this role to clergy insures that there are not unauthorized and inappropriate celebrations of sacraments taking place in the name of the congregation.

Many people are aware that, although pastors normally preside at baptisms, Lutheran teaching approves baptism by a lay person in emergencies. Other ELCA congregations are also using or considering using lay Communion presiders at weekend worship in the absence of an ordained pastor.

The persons who will serve as presiders are persons who have experience and have demonstrated high competence in worship leadership at Holy Shepherd. The presiders will be trained and oriented so that they are clear about their role and the Lutheran understanding of the Lord's Supper. Their primary purpose will be to serve as hosts so that, even when a pastor is not available, those who are hungry for spiritual food will be fed at Christ's table.

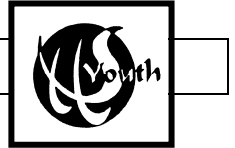


Screens & Projectors *Appeal*
