

## "HAS THE CHURCH LEFT THE BUILDING?"

## Pastor's Message

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

I truly didn't anticipate the reaction other staff members and I received to the recent message on the outdoor sign at Holy Shepherd, "The Church Has Left the Building".

Some wondered, "Is that a comment on the condition of our facility?"—which, by the way, our dedicated and hard-working Property Team has spent days and days maintaining and improving. I think they're doing great work—thanks, team!

Others wondered, "Are we announcing that Holy Shepherd has moved out of the facility?" The answer to that, of course, is "Absolutely not!"

Like I said, I didn't anticipate reactions like that—but, on the other hand, I'm grateful that people notice and care enough to wonder!

Let me tell you what I was thinking when I approved "The Church Has Left the Building" for our sign's message.

What I was thinking is that the church is *not* the building. The church is the *people*, the body of Christ. We are people who are gathered *in* the building. The building is a tool for ministry. We're blessed with a fine facility, pleasing to the eye, well-maintained, spacious and functional. It's a *wonderful* gathering place. Here we gather to worship and learn, to support and encourage one another, to be equipped for ministry and mission. It is good to gather, and good to have a fine gathering place. But the building is *not* the church. The *church* is the *people*.

And the people are the church even when we are *not* at the building! The people are the church even when we've *left* the building! In fact, I'm more and more convinced that our gathering takes place *so that* we are equipped to leave the building. We gather—and we are sent. We are sent into the world to participate in God's life-giving work and to announce that God is at work in the world.

When teams of people eagerly and joyfully respond to the call for volunteers for Habitat for Humanity, to build a home for someone with financial challenges, *the church has left the building to serve God and the world!*

When numerous people volunteer at The Action Center, or other ministries of food and shelter for the poor and homeless, *the church has left the building!*

When the people of God visit, call, cook for, and assist those who are sick or homebound, *the church has left the building to serve God and others!*

When the people of God speak of our faith or invite neighbors, friends, family members, fellow students, or co-workers to participate in worship or a ministry of the church, we've taken our faith with us. *The church has left the building!*

We are sent. We gather in the building to be strengthened, refreshed, and renewed so we can do God's work in our daily lives. And then we, the church, leave the building—sent to serve God, share God's life with the world, and announce that God is at work in the world.

May God empower the church to leave the building, sent in mission, sent to serve!
