

"KEEPING SABBATH"

Dear Brothers & Sisters in Christ,

"Remember the Sabbath day, and keep it holy." (Exodus 20:8) "The Sabbath was made for humankind, and not humankind for the Sabbath." (Mark 2:27)

As we know, Pastor Michael is in the midst of a well-deserved three-month Sabbath. So, when we read in our Mark adult class Jesus' statement about the intention of Sabbath, it stirred me to reflect on the whole notion of Sabbath, and how I might keep it in my life, even when I'm in my regular routine of work and daily life. So, let me share some reflections, and invite you to reflect along with me.

Why does God command Sabbath observance? As I grow older, it becomes more and more clear to me that God commands us to do what is good for us. Why? Because, like a loving parent, God values a relationship with us. And, like a loving parent, God wants us to be safe and well. That's why God makes rules—for our own good! And, in the biblical tradition, God's instructions about Sabbath and its purpose are central.

So, why Sabbath? If I'm right, God commands Sabbath-keeping because it's good for us. Maybe God knows something about our need for rest; after all, even *God* rested after doing the hard work of creation (Genesis 2:1-3)! Maybe God knows something about our need to set aside time to nurture our relationships with God and others through worship, study, and relationship-building. Maybe that's why Jesus said, in essence, Sabbath is meant not to be a burden, but a gift.

And gifts are meant to be used—appropriately. That's the challenge for me. How about you? Using the gift of Sabbath, finding balance—especially when I work on the Sabbath day! Many of you do as well, or your kids or grandkids have sports activities, or there's not just enough time to get all the household tasks done. Oh, we are so busy, aren't we! And, in many ways, that's good. But not when it's out of balance. Then, being busy can become a god—I know, I've been there—and not a god that gives life, but, rather a god which burdens us, robs us of joy, and can even make us sick. God doesn't want that for *any* of us! God wants to give us *life!*

So how do I—how do *we*—keep Sabbath? How do we make space for refreshment in our lives, time to care for our bodies, to care for relationships with God and others? I don't have a "one size fits all" formula, but I do think God expects us to worship, study, pray, rest, and nurture our relationships. But I do offer this check-list for any of us who want to improve our overall well-being by tending to our bodies, spirits and relationships.

- How am I tending to my need for *worship*? Especially if schedules prevent us from gathering with God's people on the weekend, how can we still worship? (I'd be glad to talk with you about that!)
- How am I tending to my need for study and prayer?
- How am I tending to my relationships?
- How am I tending to my need for rest?
- Is my life in balance?

God desires wholeness for us. God knows that our wholeness includes our need for worship and rest, and tending to ourselves and our relationships. God wants us to enjoy abundant life—and one way to live in abundance is by keeping Sabbath!

We continue to be so grateful for the support of Holy Shepherd...your in-kind and financial donations have helped us so much!

The Action Center has been popping...in fact, one day we called it “Christmas in July” because sometimes we saw 230+families in one day. School supplies went to over 5,000 children (an increase of 32%.)

The volunteers keep coming...and Holy Shepherd is a big part of that! Last year 4,700 volunteers worked a total of nearly 10,000 hours. This is equivalent to 43 full-time employees at the Action Center. We'll also be doing Thanksgiving Packing in early November.

12. Administrative Office help – always needed, one-time projects, and off-and-on projects during the year. Contact the church office.

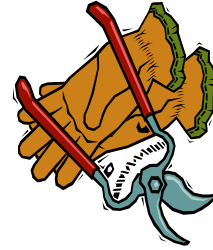
13. Purge and reorganize office files – big job at first, perhaps recurring yearly?

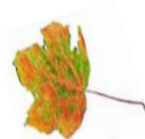

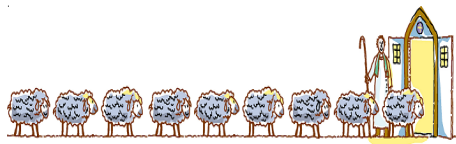
